# Postoperative instructions

Tension-free Vaginal Tape Urinary Incontinence procedure (TVT)

Please follow your surgeon's instructions if they differ from the following statements.



#### Your return home

#### **Dressings**

- · Remove your primary dressing the next day.
- You may shower after removing your dressing.
- No baths or pools are permitted for four weeks following your surgery.
- Keep the little dressings (Steri-Strips<sup>™</sup>)
  directly over your incisions for a full seven
  days.
- If a little dressing falls off (during shower), no need to replace it.
- If there are stitches, they will dissolve gradually.

#### Diet:

You may resume your normal diet when you get home.

#### **Physical activities**

- · Walking and climbing stairs is permitted.
- · Avoid all sports for six weeks.
- Do not lift objects heavier than ten pounds for six weeks
- Do not drive for 48 hours after your surgery or longer if you are taking pain medication.
- Abstain from sexual activities or relations for six weeks after your surgery.

#### Pain control

- Take your prescribed medications regularly or take Tylenol™ and Advil™.
- It's normal to have light vaginal bleeding in the days following this surgery. Wear a sanitary pad if needed.

## Call your doctor or visit your nearest Emergency Department if you have:

- redness and swelling;
- hardening or discharge (other than blood) of the incision;
- foul smelling vaginal discharge;
- · heavy vaginal bleeding
- fever and chills;
- · an increase in pain;
- · pain and heat from the calf;
- · vomiting and/or;
- · sudden shortness of breath.

Note: It is common for individuals who menstruate to experience an irregular menstrual cycle in the weeks following general anaesthesia
